
Agile project management



Further training to become an agile project manager improves the chances of re-entering the primary labour market. Jobs such as Agile Coach, Scrum Master, Product Owner, Project Manager or Agile Leader are highly sought-after attributes in current job advertisements.



Content of agile project management



Agility and agile approaches are in vogue. There are hardly any companies left in Germany that have not yet tried to generate **positive effects** for the organisation or for projects **through agility**. In order to successfully anchor agile principles in the organisation, two essential factors are needed: the appropriate methods and employees trained in the application of the methodology who competently fill the various roles in the agile projects.

Probably the best-known **agile approach is Scrum**. Due to its simple structure and clearly defined roles, the methodology can **quickly be used productively** in companies. Scrum is a globally known and recognised principle. IPMA® Level D is an internationally recognised certification for project management professionals (m/f/d). It is based on international standards of the International Competence Baseline (ICB), defined by the International Project Management Association (IPMA). The IPMA is represented in Germany by the GPM, which is the "Deutsche Gesellschaft für Projektmanagement e.V."

The certification of persons is carried out by PM-ZERT, the independent certification body of GPM. The certificate **"IPMA® Level D -Certified Project Management Associate",** which you acquire upon completion of our course, is **recognised worldwide**.
